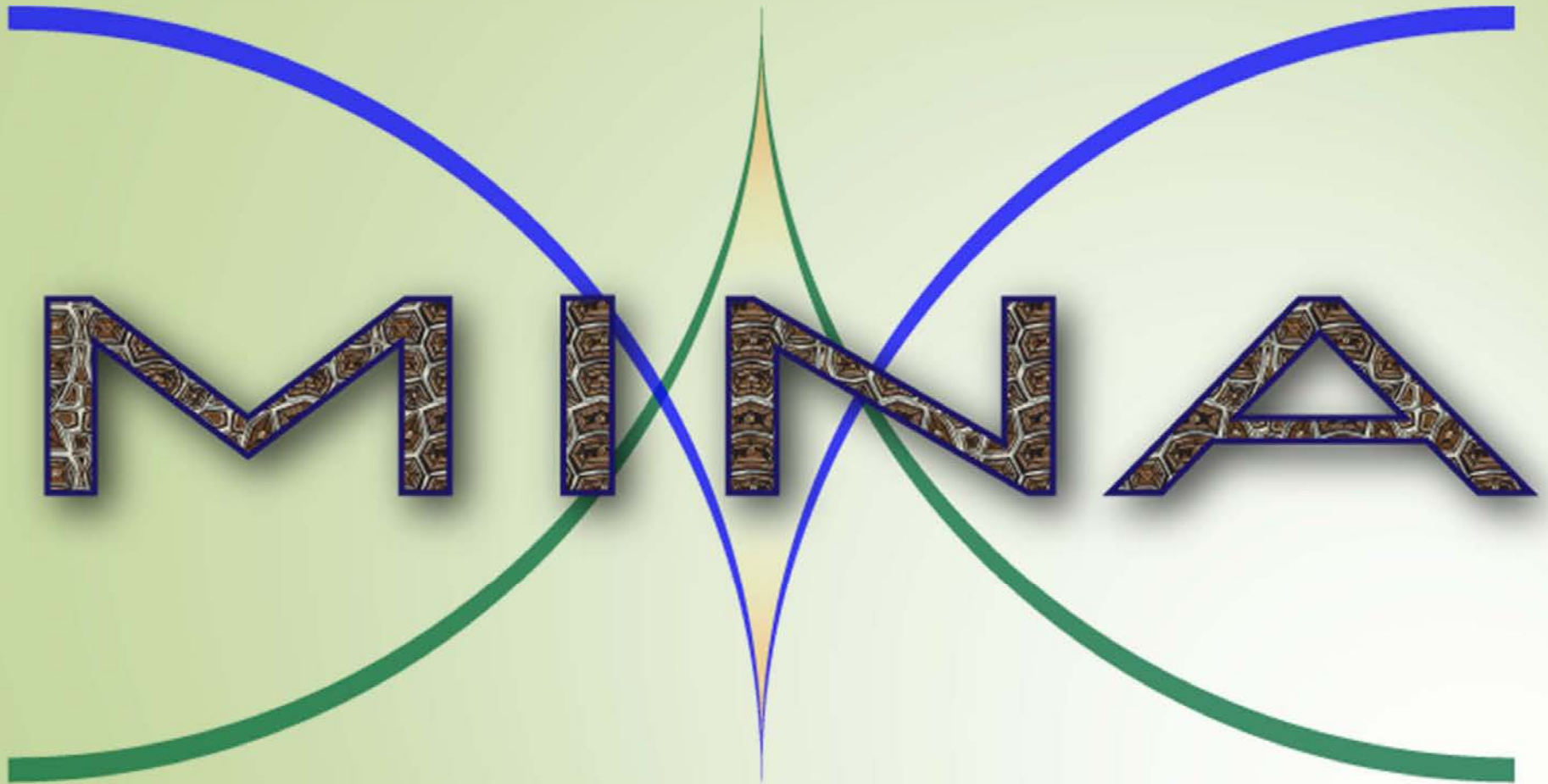

The Rota Bridled White-eye, *Zosterops rotensis*



Named for its small size, this bird is called Nosa in Chamorro'. Listed as endangered in January 2004 by the U.S Fish and Wildlife, this tiny bird occurs only on the island of Rota. An estimated 89% of the Rota Bridled population have declined between 1982 and 1996 (Fancy and Snetsinger 2001). Threats to these vulnerable species are due to their 1.) high elevation habitat of which these forest areas are strongly exposed to heavy winds and numerous typhoons resulting in complete foliation of all forest and habitat damages; 2.) deer browsing; and 3.) predation by black drongos.

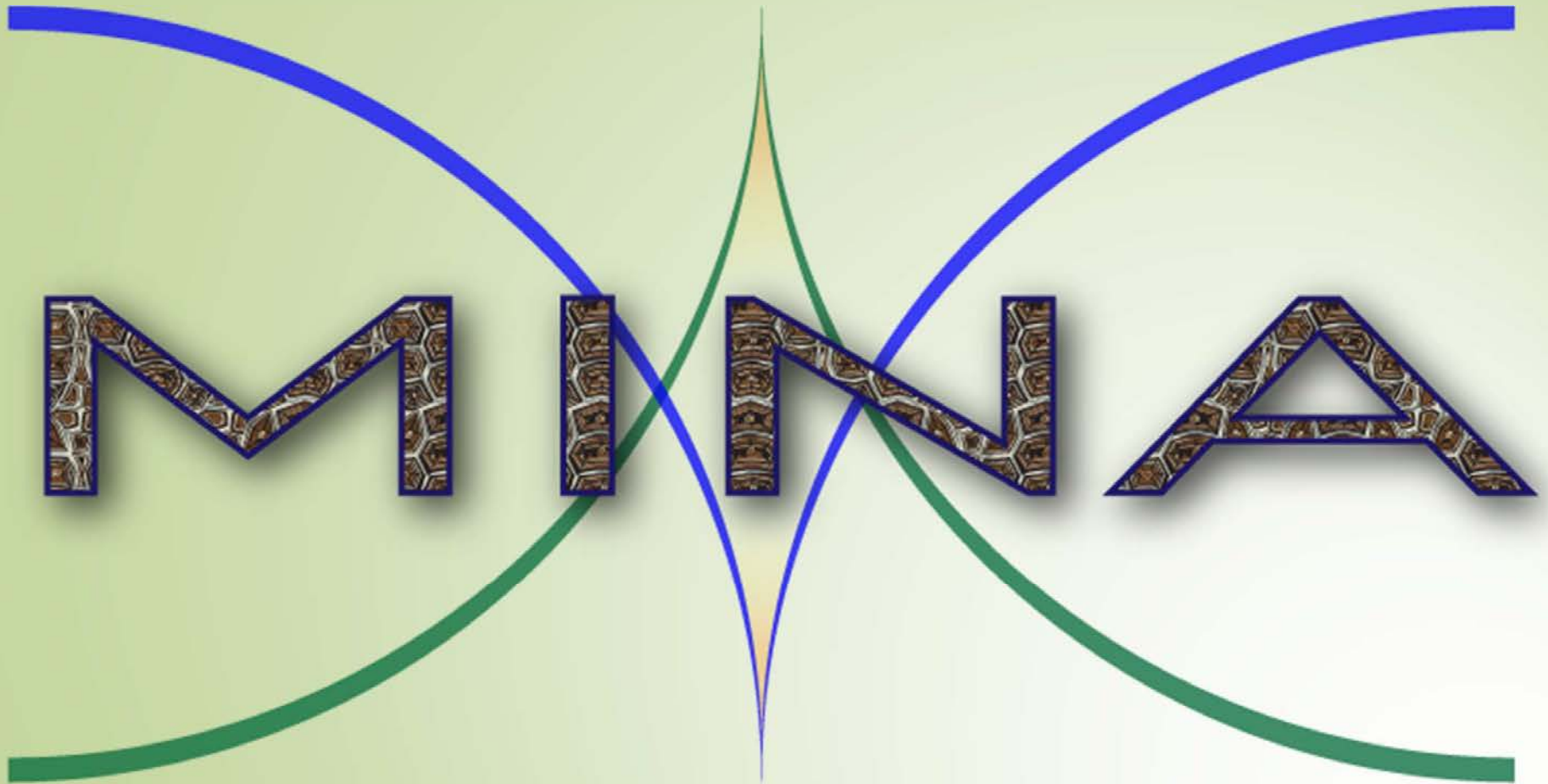

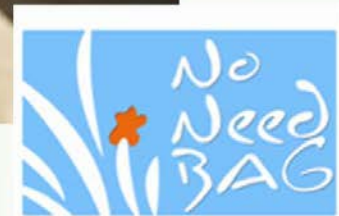

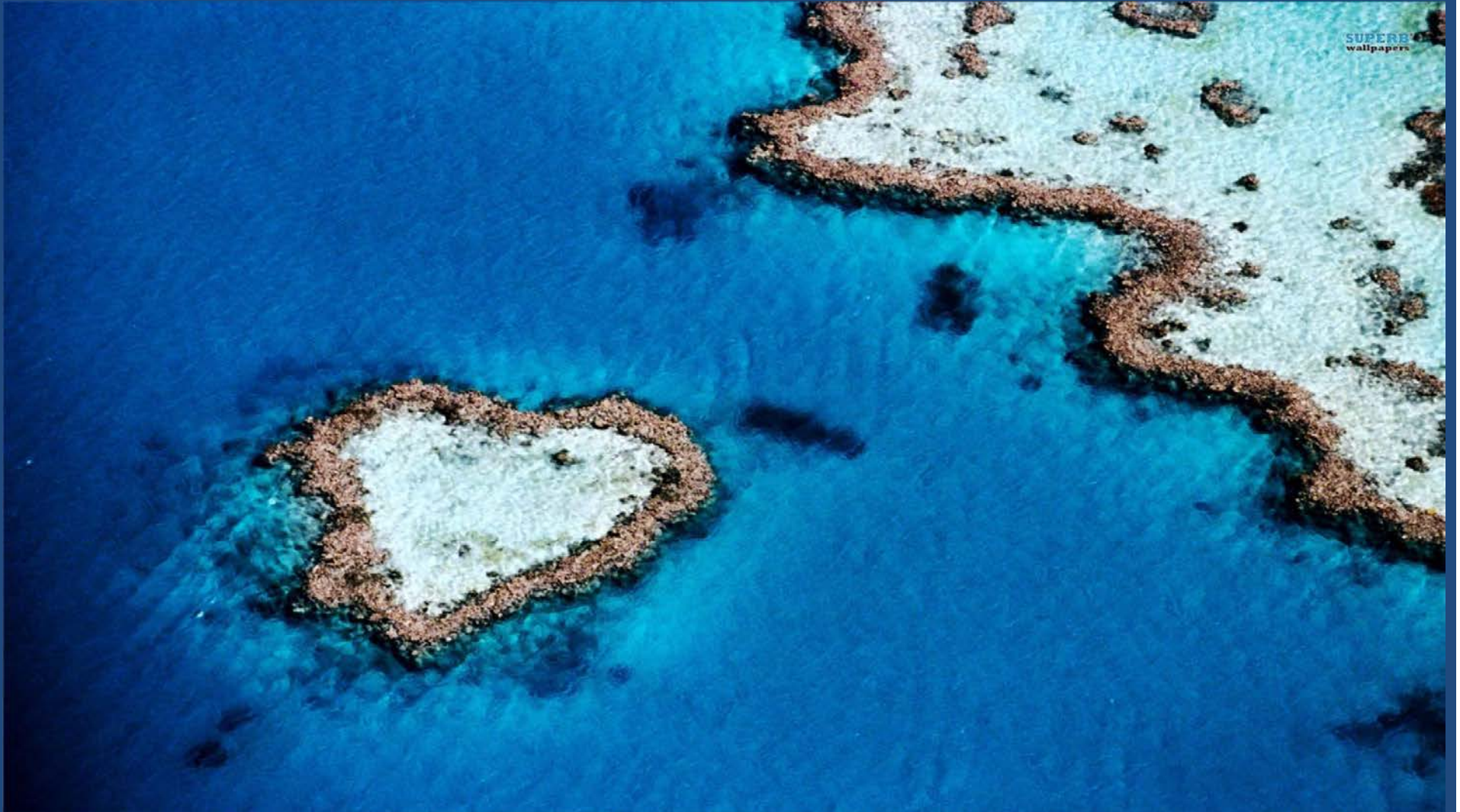
